1. What amounts of money can you show with only 2 coins?

**2¢, 6¢, 11¢, 10¢, 15¢, and 20¢**

2. Show **8¢** in 2 ways.

3. Show **12¢** in 3 ways.

4. Choose an amount of money more than 10¢ and less than 20¢. Show that amount in 2 ways.
